

Dear Contributors to *The University Bookman*,

We are pleased to consider your piece (“Content”) for publication. Please be advised of the following guidelines, terms, and conditions.

We typically pay \$150 for Content, upon publication, on a quarterly basis. Publication is at the *Bookman*’s discretion and payment is contingent upon publication. Word length should be approximately 1200-1400 words for reviews, although essays may be longer. Any unsolicited submission over 2,000 words will generally not be considered. Shorter reviews, for our Books in Little feature, run approximately 250-500 words, for which we pay \$75.

We are a small nonprofit, and our work on the editorial level is essentially a labor of love. Our ability to pay is contingent on donations from individuals and foundations. We try to concentrate those funds on freelance writers and journalists, and encourage reviewers in a position to do so to waive the honorarium to further the work of the *Bookman*.

The Content should be geared to a non-academic audience. Technical terms should be explained and historical figures or events briefly described to provide context, including life and death dates for individuals discussed substantively. Please avoid use of the first-person singular.

Please provide a preferred biographical note at the end of the Content. For reviews, please provide full book details at the beginning of the review. You may provide a suggested title, but the *Bookman* may decide not to use it. The *Bookman* may adjust for grammar and style and make minor copy-editing changes to the Content before publication without your prior approval, but will seek your approval before any substantive changes.

You agree the Content will not have been published elsewhere and that you are submitting the Content as an independent contractor. *The University Bookman* may decide not to publish the Content for any or no reason, in which case you will be notified promptly.

The University Bookman will hold the copyright on any published Content; publication date is at *The University Bookman*’s discretion. *The University Bookman* can choose to reprint the Content in any format and can allow other websites or publications to post the Content on such site or in such publication without your approval.

You must seek *The University Bookman*’s permission to republish or repost the Content, although links to the Content on a personal website or via personal social media accounts is allowed without prior permission so long as credit to *The University Bookman* is given with a link to the full *University Bookman* review if feasible.
